Try to observe at least 30-60 minutes/week. Please mark records for each bird species that you see or hear each semimonth by an "X" or by the maximum number of birds you estimate seeing or hearing at one time (do not add birds from more than one observation) using the 1-5 abundance scale. **If you use the 1-5 scale, it may be easiest to record the abundance class for a species the first time it is noted, and then revise the abundance if more are noted at one time later during the semimonthly period.** Using "X" is fine, and you can mix using "X" or the 1-5 scale for the same or different species. **The goal is for observers to keep records, so use whatever works for you! Records for part of a year are useful, too!**

Write comments or counts of species of interest on back of this sheet or in a journal.
